Bluegrass Orthopaedics has a full-time opening for a licensed athletic trainer at a NCAA Division III University in the Lexington, Kentucky area. This is a full-time, 12-month position with benefits. The athletic trainer will work under the direction of the Director of Sports Medicine and Business Development. The athletic trainer will work with a staff of (4) athletic trainers providing health care to approximately 400 collegiate student-athletes in 22 sports.

This position will be required to work full-time at the university covering intercollegiate athletics, while working to prevent, assess, and treat athletic injuries as well as educate athletes, parents, and coaches. Responsibilities include coverage of practice and games (including travel) of assigned sports, daily treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries, referral to health care professionals, and other administrative duties. The athletic trainer will work to keep solid documentation records of injuries and treatments utilizing an electronic medical record system. Bluegrass Orthopaedics strives to be at the forefront of the most current practices and research, so occasional case studies and other research may be completed. This position also offers extensive opportunities for per diem work.
