Marco Avila joined Hancock College Prep's debate team his sophomore year, which happened to be the inception of the school's debate team, under coach Ray Salazar. Bright-eyed, Marco was seeking extracurricular involvement that provided academic challenge, mentorship, and peer connection, and he found these opportunities and more with the Chicago Debates program.

As a member, Marco participated in debate preparation, practice, and competition throughout the school year, engaging with his peers and learning principles foundational to his success along the way. Through his involvement in the after-school program, Marco developed four crucial skills—critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and creativity—skills needed to succeed in college and beyond.

Continuing Impact

Marco is now a student at DePaul University located in a northern neighborhood of Chicago. Participating in the Financial Literacy Tournament while in the program inspired him to study finance—just one of the ways his involvement continues to positively influence his future.
