At Covington Memorial now, active listening, learning more about deceased loved ones and their passions and interests, translates to customizing funeral services. If someone loved horses, Covington brings in a horse carriage to be their escort. A mariachi band was booked because the deceased loved the music, making it more of a celebration of life than a traditional funeral. Food at the repast was made using the recipes of a loved and passed on grandmother. For another client, a food truck cooked outside. "We changed the entire funeral home for them to eat, be comfortable, and share
